The state of Wisconsin consistently ranks high in the nation in quality and efficiency of its healthcare systems.



Education

With five institutions of higher learning, a great public education system, and progressive options like choice and charter schools, the Kenosha Area is equipping students to be successful at work and in life.

Kenosha County is one of the largest communities in the state and consequently has some of the largest schools. This means that there are a wide range of academic and extra curricular programs for every type of child.



Kenosha Unified School District (KUSD) serves the communities of Kenosha, Pleasant Prairie and Somers - more than 20,000 students in all. Charter, choice, and private school are also excellent options available for students to consider. The smaller school districts in the western part of the County have highly-rated and well performing schools.

KUSD is the third-largest school district in the state of Wisconsin and serves more than 19,000 students in grades 4K-12 annually. Of these students, 10,363 are economically disadvantaged and 2,603 have one or more disabilities.

In addition, KUSD is an urban school district that consists of:

- > 3 high schools (grades 9-12)
- > 5 middle schools (grades 6-8)
- > 22 elementary schools (4K-5)
- > 5 charter schools
- > 5 choice schools
- > 1 specialty school
- > 1 Head Start facility

Choice & Charter options through KUSD: Open to all families in Kenosha, Pleasant Prairie, and Somers

Every KUSD student has the option to attend other schools by choice. Education

Kenosha is definitely a college town! More than 3,000 degrees are awarded annually in Kenosha County from one of five institutions of higher learning operating here, each with its own academic programs and focus.

Kenosha County has excellent higher education resources that consistently contribute interns, educated graduates, and engaged faculty to the community. The combined enrollment of these institutions is over 13,000 students.

Then there are the world-class institutions like UW-Madison, Milwaukee School of Engineering, Northwestern University and the University of Chicago, to name a few, all within a 90-minute drive.
